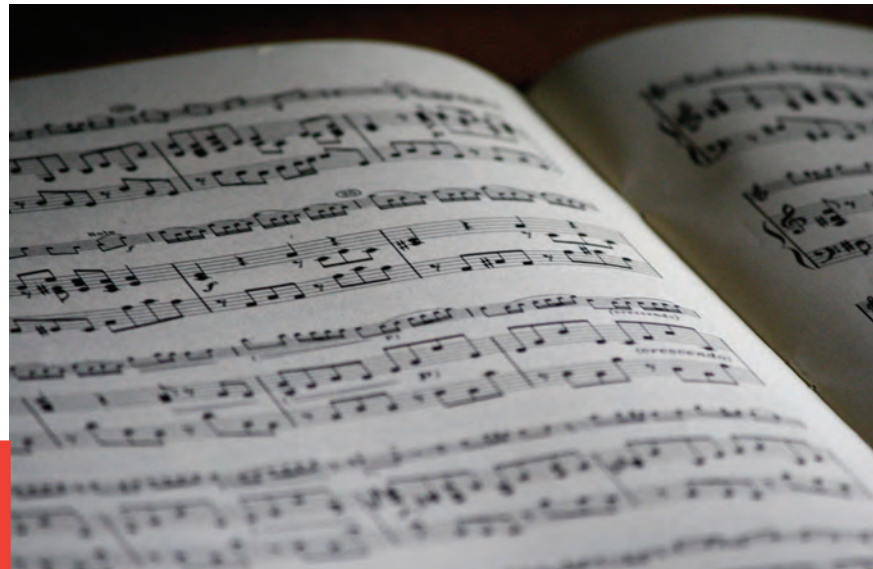

PAUL SÁNCHEZ • TUE | Sept. 20, 2016

Sánchez is the newly appointed Director of Piano Studies at the College of Charleston. He is the only American concert pianist to earn a Master of Spanish Music degree under Alicia de Larrocha, which he earned during his research in Spain as a Fulbright Fellow. Sánchez has served on the faculty at Baylor University's School of Music and at the Wheaton College Conservatory of Music and has concertized throughout North America and Europe. He founded the Dakota Sky International Piano Festival. He holds Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from the Eastman School of Music.

ANGELA CHENG • TUE | Oct. 25, 2016

Cheng has earned many honors including a Gold Medal at the Arthur Rubinstein International Piano Masters Competition, the distinction of being the first Canadian to win the Montreal International Piano Competition, additional first prizes at the William Kapell International Piano Competition and D'Angelo Young Artist Competition, the Medal of Excellence from the Salzburg Mozarteum, and more. A native of Hong Kong, Cheng studied extensively at Indiana University and at the Juilliard School. She is on the faculty at Oberlin Conservatory.

MARINA LOMAZOV • TUE | Feb. 28, 2017

Lomazov studied at the Kiev Conservatory, where she became the youngest First Prize Winner at the all-Kiev Piano Competition. She holds degrees from The Juilliard School and the Eastman School of Music, the latter bestowing upon her the highly coveted Artist's Certificate – an honor the institution had not given a pianist for nearly 20 years. She has won prizes in the Cleveland International Piano Competition, William Kapell International Piano Competition, Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition, and Hilton Head International Piano Competition. She is on the faculty at the University of South Carolina.

SERGEI BABAYAN • TUE | March 21, 2017

Born in Armenia into a musical family, Babayan studied at the Moscow Conservatory. Following his first trip outside of the USSR in 1989, he won consecutive first prizes in major international competitions including the Robert Casadesus International Piano Competition (renamed the Cleveland International Piano Competition), the Hamamatsu Piano Competition, and the Scottish International Piano Competition. Babayan is on the faculty at The Juilliard School and is an artist in residence at the Cleveland Institute of Music.

Graduates of the prestigious Moscow Conservatory, this faculty duo has impressed audiences locally and around the world. Both musicians are on the faculty at the College of Charleston and were recently made honorary professors at the Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine (Kiev Conservatory) have previously been named honorary professors at Lviv State Academy of Music and the Odessa State Music Academy. The program will include works from the Romantic Period.

Ilya Kaler, VIOLIN; Yuriy Bekker, VIOLIN; Natalia Khoma, CELLO; Volodymyr Vynnytsky, PIANO

Ilya Kaler is one of the most outstanding personalities of the violin today, whose career ranges from that of a soloist and recording artist to chamber musician and professor. A three-time gold medal winner, he received top honors at the Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, the Sibelius Competition in Helsinki and the Paganini Competition in Genoa. Kaler attended the Moscow Central Music School and the Moscow State Conservatory. The program will feature works from the Romantic Period.
